On Thursday July 4, 2019, America will celebrate its 243rd anniversary of the signing of the “Declaration of Independence.” Congress had voted to declare independence two days prior on July 2, but did not actually declare it until two days later on July 4, 1776. The Declaration of Independence was written by The Committee of Five: Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Robert Livingston, and Roger Sherman. There were a total of 56 signers. Two lost their sons serving in the Revolutionary Army; another had two sons captured.”
